## City Obligations Regarding the Library

In preparing this edition, the Mission Viejo HOA has decided to file an injunction to address the 50 year operating agreement regarding our library. We would like to acknowledge those individuals and organizations who have contributed to this cause including Seville Townhomes with their generous contribution of \$1,000. We feel very confident in our legal stance. If you would like to help us out financially, we would greatly appreciate it. You can do this online or by check. We are tracking our library legal

defense fund money in a separate account.

It is clear that the City continues to regard Mission Viejo as a long forgotten master planned neighborhood. There are many agreements that the City refuses to honor properly including right-of-way maintenance issues and the Library. Meanwhile, we are told that the City is planning to give over \$90 million dollars in tax benefits to a developer north of



Mission Viejo so they can build new libraries and recreation centers.

Why build new libraries when the one in our neighborhood is serving such a large patron population? Why is the City forgetting its obligations that were made when they accepted our neighborhood as a development? Perhaps we should warn those who may be purchasing new homes in Aurora that they might face the same consequences in 35 years.

As for finding money to keep our library open, there are literally hundreds of ways the City could find the resources. It's simply a matter of priorities. The City has what it calls "green" money set aside plus over 30 million in reserves. That's not to mention the fact that the City could easily balance its budget better by cutting other departments more equally. Finally, the City needs to explore sources of revenue that do not hit homeowners with new taxes. An example might be to create a small business loan program with the interest earned used to service the libraries, recreation centers, right-of-way maintenance and to pay off the City's debt obligations. However, initiatives like this require thinking outside the box. Let's hope the City acknowledges its legal obligations with our community and truly addresses our needs.

## 2009 - Mission Viejo Achievements and **Celebrations**

2009 has been a banner year for accomplishments and activities sponsored by the Mission Viejo HOA:

- 1. Neighborhood Trash Service Pays Off. In January, Pro Disposal was voted to be the neighborhood trash service. By the end of May, there were 778 residents enrolled in the program and Pro Disposal began to give a rebate of \$2.00 a month for each resident enrolled in the program. This has created, since June, an additional revenue source of approximately \$1,600 a month!
- 2. Mission Viejo Reporter has been published each month of 2009 at no cost to the neighborhood. Colorado Lasertype and Todd McMahon can be thanked for this publication.
- 3. Mission Viejo Reporter has been distributed since February to all of the residents at no cost thanks to a wonderful group of volunteers. This has saved the neighborhood \$3,300 this year.
